PUP

**Mobility Program:
The COMET Pick Up Program**



The COMET Pick Up Program gives you a debit card to pay up to \$50 a month in taxi, Lyft or Uber rides.

Available if you:

1. Live outside The COMET service area.
2. Live inside Richland or Lexington County.
3. Live inside the Columbia Urbanized Area.

V-TRIP

**Mobility Program:
Volunteer Transportation Program**



V-TRIP lets riders get money back to pay the people in their life who drive them. If you have a friend from church, work, school, or the neighborhood, who gives you a ride this program may help cover gas. You can travel up to 100 miles a month and a list of trips made must be submitted monthly to be reimbursed.

Available if you:

1. Live outside The COMET service area.
2. Live inside Richland or Lexington County.
3. Live inside the Columbia Urbanized Area.

COVID Rules of the Road to Remember



TSA requires proper wearing of face masks, per federal law. Face masks are to be worn at all times. Failure to comply will result in denial of boarding or removal, and may result in penalties.

- Neck Gaiters are allowed as long as they are double-ply (or folded over for extra protection).
- Face shields must be accompanied by a mask.
- Open chin bandanas are allowed IF they are also accompanied by a mask.



Travel on fixed route must be one-way to a specific location – no continuous riding without a destination.



Boarding some buses may require you to enter through the rear doors, unless you have a wheelchair or stroller or are disabled and needing assistance.

IN THE COMMUNITY

The COMET is offering Free Covid-19 Vaccinations at the COMET Central hub.

In partnership with Health Force, LLC, beginning in May 2021 The COMET will offer free COVID-19 vaccines — based on supply and availability — at the COMET Central hub located on the corner of Laurel and Sumter Streets in the back gated parking lot. The vaccine will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis as follows:

Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays

8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.

Sundays

10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

Have you received your COVID-19 vaccination?

Anyone who is 16+ is now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccination.

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (SCDHEC) took a phased approach to distributing the COVID-19 vaccine to ensure that high risk individuals were able to receive their vaccine first. We've officially entered Phase 2 of SCDHEC's COVID-19 vaccination plan, and anyone who is 16 or older is now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

You can also ride The COMET to the Community Vaccination Center at Columbia Place Mall (Routes 55, 75, 501) to receive your COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccines will start on April 12, 2021 and the site will be open from 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

Catch The COMET to Get Your Vaccine. The COMET transit services are always available to get you to where you need to go. However, to receive the vaccine, you must first:
